INSURANCE NOTES

We have spent a great deal of time lately on Insurance, both property and liability. I have had many calls from members and even a few insurance agents. I really appreciate the questions and the effort members have put into getting their coverage to meet the LYC minimum requirements for moored vessels and boathouses. The moorage agreement states :"**for vessel operation and boat-house ownership having annual limits of not less then \$100,000 for property damage and \$500,000 annual aggregate single limit for personal injury or death**" (i.e. Liability minimum of \$500,000). I have seen many polices submitted with liability of \$300k and an Umbrella policy . This is a great way to go and keeps your insurance costs down a bit. I have also learned that small boats fall under a homeowners policy for some carriers, generally 50 hp or less. The liability for a small boat on a homeowners policy is generally only \$1000, so the remaining liability would have to be under an umbrella policy.

Thanks again for your attention to these matters.
